City Ladies Golf Meet Scheduled ^{6/18/71}

Tuesday and Wednesday Lochland Country Club will be the scene of the Ladies' Inter-City Tournament. The annual event will begin Tuesday with everyone to tee off before 10 a.m.

Championship flight and presidential flight action will be 27-holes while the remaining flights will consist of 18-hole play. In the championship and presidential flights, 18-holes will be played on Tuesday with everyone scheduled for nine-holes on Wednesday.

Defending champion Cindy Friend will be back to defend her title in the championship division and last year's runner-up in championship play, Doris Kadel, will also be on hand this year.

Naomi Thiel, the presidential flight winner from last summer, will be back to risk her title.

A five dollar entry fee is required of all entrants. Any member of the three local golf courses is eligible to participate in the event. Women under 18-years may participate only with a special invitation.

Following the nine-hole play on Wednesday a luncheon will be held where trophies and prizes will be distributed.

Second City Title for Cyndy Friend

Her 27-hole total of 126 on rounds of 44-38-44 gave her a seven stroke advantage over her nearest competitor, Marge Smith. The runner-up totaled a 133 on the strength of 46-45-42. Bobbi Hopp placed third in the championship flight with a 135.

A total of 43 golfers participated in the annual event. All members of local golf clubs were eligible to compete in the tourney. Play in the championship and presidential flights was 27-holes while the remaining two flights were 18-hole competition.

Eddie Perdeu took top honors in the presidential flight with 53-53-51 scores for a 157. One stroke back in regulation play were Marie Crabtree and Babe Conway. The two had a playoff for the runner-up spot and it was won by Crabtree.

Two strokes off the winning presidential pace was Lou Bogan who fired a 51-56-52 for a 159.

Bette White opened up a three stroke lead over her nearest challenger in the first flight. She totaled a 109 on rounds of 37-52. After the first day she held a slim one stroke lead over runner-up Nadean Hoelck who fired rounds of 53-54 for a 109.

Third place in the first flight went to Irma Nejezchleb with a 59-56 for a 115.

Hastings' Marge Smith trailed Miss Smith in the championship flight of the 18 hole bracket. She fired an 89 over the Lochland layout.
