NO DANGER AT PAULINE
The Adams County sheriff's office alerted people in Pauline, as did the Civil Defense office. The waters of the Little Blue did not rise dangerously high in that area, however.
It was reported Wednesday that the river was up near Oak. The water rose during the early morning hours to about four feet. This is about three feet higher than normal. Bank capacity is 10 feet. Some trouble was encountered near Angus.
Nuckolls County Highway Department workers had to remove two large logs that had become lodged above a bridge about one-half mile west of Angus.
Trouble is usually encountered at the wooden bridge when the Blue waters rise, according to Angus residents.
The rising water, though not felt to be a danger by Wednesday, continued eastward toward Pauline.
