

# Hopp defends title in Ladies City meet

HASTINGS - There is no place like home for Hobbie Hopp, especially when she is competing for a victory in golf.

Hopp overtook second round leader Doris Kadel by two strokes at her home course, Lochland Country Club, to win her second straight Hastings Ladies City Golf Tournament here Wednesday.

The two-time winner shot her best golf of the three-day event at her home course, blazing to a 44 on the front nine and repeating the score on the final half for an 88. Hopp finished the three-day, 54-hole tourney with a composite score of 218.

Second place finisher Kadel led Hopp Tuesday by outplaying her 88 to 89 at Elks Meadowbrook Country Club. But Kadel was able to take advantage of the situation on Tuesday — Elks is her home course.

Hopp and Kadel turned the championship flight of the 18-hole division into a two-player race for the title, as third place finisher Marge Smith trailed with a distant 228.

Marie Crabtree finished behind Smith by one stroke with a 54-hole total of 229. Mary Walley was fifth at 241.

MaDonna Bell topped the field in the 18hole division president's flight with a 54hole total of 249. Ruth Svoboda placed three strokes behind Bell for second place.

In the nine-hole division tournament finals held Wednesday at Elks Meadow-brook Country Club, Donna Granger won the first flight division with a three-day total of 151—four strokes better than runner up Lou Bogan.

Judy Anderson was the second flight winner with a 163 while Elsie Karmazin was runner-up with a 165.

Jill Christensen, a high school student, won the third flight finals with a 154, finishing 12 strokes ahead of Gerry Plebuch and Marilyn Bergman who tied for second.

Fourth flight winner was Jean Portwood

who shot a three-day total of 178. Runnerup was Alice Erickson with a 181.

In the fifth flight, Marcy Vontz took the title with a 179.
